OCTOBER 4 --- RESPECT LIFE SUNDAY

Dear Parishioners

It is interesting writing this week because I am not sure if the OLM and St Mark's communities we will be together or if OLM will return to the newly renovated church. Either way we will all adjust. There are so many causes that we hear about in our church and all are so worthwhile. We are in the midst of our Bishop's Annual Appeal and to the parishioners of St. Mark's this is an important work in our diocese that seek to help improve the lives of others whom some do not think are to be respected as a child of God.

Today however at our liturgy we remember that it is Respect Life Sunday and the protection of life is our most fundamental value. We are given life by God to be used with a sense of reverence and joy. We who have the spirit of God's life in us through Baptism are the ones who are called to protect the lives of all people. We are the ones who must speak up when life is threaten in the womb or in the aged. Who are we to know the mind of God? One of the prayers of the psalms reminds us. Who are we to make a judgement upon the quality of life of another person? Each of us has been given a unique life to live for the Lord. By helping and respecting and according others the dignity that a person is entitled to as a creature of God, we give great witness to the value of life and we give witness to the gospel values upon which we live our lives.

Pray today for the protection of life and not its destruction. Pray for an end of war that claims too many lives. Pray for the gift of Christ's love and peace to settle into the hearts of all peoples of the world so that the life of each person will be seen as a reflection of God's love...Fr. Joe

A LOOK BACK ON THE VISIT OF POPE FRANCIS...

This past week saw a tremendous turnout of people in three major cities and Pope Francis did not disappoint. He is a man who speaks his mind and the Gospel truth in clear, simple words that have the power of the Spirit behind them. I asked several people this week what they liked most and got a whole variety of answers which actually is good because it means Pope Francis' message resounded in different ways with different people. Our task is to reflect on his words and the challenge that he left us as Catholic in America and the whole American people. We were reminded that we have so much and we have wasted some of our resources not for the betterment of people but sometimes for goals less worthy of the Gospel. His concluding talk at the World Meeting of Families mass stressed to us how important the family element is to our society. Perhaps one of the discussions we might have with our family members is to ask each person what is the most important thing that make them a family. Old and Young have a mission to build up the family. I hope you get to read some of the people's remarks they are important for us to reflect upon now that he has left us and to take up the work of building up the family of God among us.

St. Junipero Serra – Pope Francis canonized this Franciscan missionary priest who came to the area of California along with the Spanish explorers. You can travel up the coast of California from San Diego (St. James) to San Francisco (St. Francis) and beyond and find the missions that he established during his work. Some, in looking back at history from today's perspective, feel that the native Americans were harshly treated by the Spanish and that might be so in some circumstances but as the Holy Father pointed out St. Junipero Serra was foremost a missionary who renounced everything and came to this new world not to mistreat others but to share with them

by his words and actions the dearest of his treasures – his knowledge of Jesus Christ and the Gospel.
