### Politics and Religion...

Recently there was an inter-mix of religion and politics as statements made by the Pope on Immigration conflicted with some others' view of how things should be done. Welcome to the challenge of being a Christian in the world today. It is not a new challenge. Christians are called to make decisions in their lives, in their community and in the world from the Gospel perspective. In the Gospel of St. Luke he records Jesus' visit to the synagogue at Nazareth (his home town). Jesus was given the Book of the Prophet Isaiah and he chooses the passage which says, "*The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has appointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed, to proclaim the acceptable Year of the Lord.*" When he finished the reading Jesus says to the crowd, "Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." Jesus is telling the people why he has come into the world. He has come among them to show concern, love and sensitivity to those most in need. Through his ministry and teaching he teaches us that as his disciples we should be of like mind, in our words and actions.

The words of Pope Francis echo the call of the Gospel. They are not new words, the concern for the poor, the oppressed, the homeless, the hungry, the thirsty, the refugee are a Gospel challenge that Christians are called to meet in every generation. We will be judged on how we respond to their needs. This Lenten time we are faced with the reality of trying to improve our spiritual life and come closer to God. One of the best ways is to look to our attitude towards our neighbors in need. The image of Pope Francis, a modern prophet, standing on the banks of the Rio Grande calling out to all to show the same concern, love and sensitivity that Jesus had for the poor should not shock us or surprise us but should challenge us even more to be people who speak out, take action and pray for solutions to the issues that face our world today... Fr. Joe

### PARTNERS IN FAITH...

I am happy to report that our parish recently received a check from our diocese for \$14,226.10. This represents the third rebate returned to us as part of the Diocesan Special Campaign "Partners in Faith". According to our special arrangement with the diocese these funds will be applied to our church mortgage.

The normal agreement for most parishes was 25% of the monies collected would be returned to the parish for whatever needs they might have. Our agreement was that 50% of the funds collected would be returned to St. Mark's with the stipulation that they would go to help pay down our mortgage.

These funds are only available because of those parishioners who are making ongoing payments on their Partners in Faith pledges. I am so grateful to all who are consistent in paying their pledge, and ask any who may have fallen behind to re-commit to their pledge if possible. It is important to the work of the Diocese and to our parish...Fr. Joe

**FOLLOW UP to the above...**Here is an update on the church mortgage. The original mortgage was signed for \$1,000,000 on July 2, 2002. The mortgage is through Peapack Gladstone Bank. The monthly payment increases or decreases every five years based upon the 30 year Treasury note. 2007 was the first 5<sup>th</sup> year review and our monthly payment was increased. However we benefitted in 2012 from a decline in interest rates which resulted in a decline in our monthly payment. Also over the past few years a couple of large parishioner donations were received which were specifically directed by the donors towards the payment of the mortgage. In addition the proceeds from the sale of the old rectory residence on Ann Road in 2012 went into the mortgage payment as directed by Bishop Serratelli.

The current balance on the mortgage is \$483,402.00. Our current monthly payment is \$ 5,703.

We have a second collection on the first Sunday of the month called "Debt Reduction". This collection is used to help us meet the monthly payment due. The average income per month of this second collection + Faith Direct deposits over the past year has been \$1,275. This leaves us with a monthly deficit of \$ 4,428 which we have to make up from ordinary funds.

The Building Fund collection that we take up on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday is used for such things as snow plowing, grass cutting, landscaping, property insurance etc.

As you can see we still have a ways to go but I do thank you for what you do financially for the parish. If your economic situation changes and you are able to help us by increasing your offertory collection or Faith Direct donations that is always appreciated. I also put in the bulletin a quarterly update on our finances. If you have any questions you can contact me and if I do not have any answer I will find out from our parish finance board...Fr. Joe

#### **WHY WE ARE CATHOLIC...**

**The Prophecy:** Zechariah 9:9: Exult greatly, O daughter Zion! Shout for joy, O daughter Jerusalem! Behold: your king is coming to you, a

just savior is he, humble, and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey.

**The Fulfillment:** John 12:12-15 - On the next day, when the great crowd that had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem, they took palm branches and went out to meet him, and cried out: "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, even the king of Israel." Jesus found a donkey and sat upon it, as is written: "Fear no more, O daughter Zion; look, your King is coming, sitting on a donkey."

#### **About the Prophecy of Zechariah**

Zechariah the prophet came from a priestly family. He was a visionary, who with the prophet Haggai worked on the rebuilding of the Temple. The New Testament Gospels quote Zechariah more than any other prophet. Part one of the book of Zechariah was written in 520 B.C. Zechariah spoke about the judgment and salvation of God and about the coming Messiah who would be a priest, governor, humble king and afflicted shepherd. Earlier a crowd had wanted to make Jesus king (6:15), and now this crowd is recognizing him as king in the city of the great King. He is indeed king, but not the sort of king the crowd had in mind.
