4. **OPEN COMMUNICATION BETWEEN PARENTS AND STAFF/STAFF AND CHILDREN/CHILDREN AND PARENTS.**
5. **PARENTS ALWAYS WELCOME.**
6. **CHILDREN EDUCATED IN RIGHT RELATIONSHIPS & WHAT TO DO IF A RELATIONSHIP ISN'T RIGHT.**
7. **ALL CHILDREN TREATED WITH DIGNITY AND RESPECT.**
8. **CLEAR RULES AND EXPECTATIONS. CONSISTENT REINFORCEMENT/CONSEQUENCES**
