### **"THE JOY OF LOVE"... AN EXHORTATION BY POPE FRANCIS ISSUED MARCH 19, 2016**

In the bulletin for the past several weeks I have included excerpts for the fourth chapter of Pope Francis' exhortation wherein Pope Francis has been reflecting on the words of St. Paul from the first letter to the Corinthians (chapter 12) "Love is patient....etc". Pope Francis reflects on these various characteristics of love that Paul wrote about to the early Christians. We are nearing the end of this particular reflection as we off the Pope's reflection on the third of the last four characteristics that Paul writes on love. Love hopes all things.

St. Paul says "Love hopes all things" in sections 116 and 117 of his exhortation Pope Francis offers this comment on "Love hopes all things..." Pope Francis writes: "Love does not despair of the future...this phrase speaks of the hope of one who knows that others can change, mature and radiate unexpected beauty and untold potential... This does not mean that everything will change in this life. Here hope comes most fully into its own, for it embraces the certainty of life after death. Each person, with all his or her failings is called to the fullness of life in heaven. There fully transformed by Christ's resurrection, every weakness, darkness and infirmity will pass away. There the person's true being will shine forth in all its goodness and beauty. This realization helps us, amid the aggravation of this present life, to see each person form a supernatural perspective in the light of hope, and await the fullness that he or she will receive in the heavenly kingdom, even if not yet visible.

### **JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY...**

"The Christian way is not easy, but this is it. To those who say, 'I don't feel like doing this,' the response is 'if you don't feel like it, that's your problem, but this is the Christian way. This is the path that Jesus teaches us. The reason to take the path of Jesus, which is mercy, is that only with a merciful heart can we do all that the Lord advises us, until the end. The Christian life is not a self-reflexive life but it comes outside of itself to give to others: it is a gift, it is love, and love does not turn back on itself, it is not selfish: it gives itself!"

### **WHY WE ARE CATHOLIC...**

The word "Church" means "convocation." It designates the assembly of those whom God's Word "convokes," i.e., gathers together to form the People of God, and who themselves, nourished with the Body of Christ, become the Body of Christ. The Church is both the means and the goal of God's plan: prefigured in creation, prepared for in the Old Covenant, founded by the words and actions of Jesus Christ, fulfilled by his redeeming cross and his Resurrection, the Church has been manifested as the mystery of salvation by the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. She will be perfected in the glory of heaven as the assembly of all the redeemed of the earth. The Church is both visible and spiritual, a hierarchical society and the Mystical Body of Christ. She is one, yet formed of two components, human and divine. That is her mystery, which only faith can accept.
