"THE JOY OF LOVE"... AN EXHORTATION BY POPE FRANCIS ISSUED MARCH 19, 2016. The past several weeks I have included excerpts from the fourth chapter of Pope Francis' exhortation wherein Pope Francis has been reflecting on the words of St. Paul from the first letter to the Corinthians (chapter 12) "Love is patient....etc". Pope Francis reflects on these various characteristics of love that Paul wrote about to the early Christians. We are at the end today of this as we offer the Pope's reflection on the last of the characteristics that Paul writes on love. Love endures all things. In sections 118 and 119 of his exhortation Pope Francis offers this comment on "Love endures all things..." The pope writes from the point of view that because love endures all things it will conquer all that is evil.

Pope Francis writes: "Love endures every trial with a positive attitude. It not only tolerates certain aggravations...but it is at the constant readiness to confront any challenge. It is a love that never gives up even in the darkest hour...when you come to the point that you look in the face of every man and see deep down within him what religion calls the 'image of God' you begin to love him in spite of everything...when you rise to the level of love, of its great beauty and power, you seek only to defeat evil... Somewhere, somebody must with a little sense and that is the strong person... The strong person is the one who cuts off the chain of evil. Somebody must have religion enough and morality enough to cut it off and inject within the very structure of the universe that strong and powerful element of love. "

If you have never read a papal document I would urge you to get a copy of this exhortation entitled "The Joy of Love "Amoris Laetitia. It is very easy to read and it can bring a lot of good reflection into your relationships. I only presented excerpts from chapter 4. There are 9 chapters and the pope's reflections are especially relevant for singles, couples and families with children. You can purchase it on Amazon. You can go to the website www.usccb.org (The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops) on the very top of the page click on the word "store" and you will see the book right on top of the page and you can place your order.

UPDATE ON SHOES FOR GHANA...

Several weeks ago both parishes of OLM and St. Mark's contributed shoes for the children of Ghana. Here is an update report that was sent to me. About two weeks ago the barrels and five boxes of shoes arrived in Ghana and cleared their port customs. On July 12th the school headmaster traveled by overnight bus to Accra, the capitol of Ghana to arrange to transport them back to the village 170 miles away. They arrived intact and last week the local school officials began the process of identifying the children most in need who will benefit from your donations.
