TWENTY NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Exodus 17:8-13
 Amalek and his people attacked the Israelites, so Moses instructed Joshua to lead some of the Israelites into battle the next day. While Moses kept his hands raised in prayer, the Israelites were winning. But when he put his hands down, they would begin to lose. So two others helped him keep his hands raised, and Joshua and the Israelites won the battle.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 3:14—4:2
 Paul tells Timothy that the Scriptures are inspired by God and are an excellent tool in teaching others about God’s expectations of his people. Knowledge of the Scriptures, coupled with faith in Jesus, will lead many people to salvation. Paul urges Timothy to continue preaching the gospel, although this will sometimes be a difficult task.

Gospel: Luke 18:1-8
 Jesus speaks about a corrupt judge who lacked respect for either God or man. A widow repeatedly asked him to settle a case in her favor. He finally settled the case, only because he grew weary of listening to her requests. Jesus points out that if even this corrupt judge eventually listened, then God, who is just, will certainly answer the pleas of his people.





THE NEEDS ARE MANY...

I try to include in my daily prayer the needs of many groups of people. Of course, I pray for my family, for friends and for the parishioners of both parishes. I also try to keep in touch with the news each day to hear of others who might need some prayers. Recently the victims of the hurricane come to mine. POPE FRANCIS NEWS THIS WEEK: Named 17 new cardinals this week. In keeping with his custom of diversity from different countries in the world wide church he named them from various parts of the world, including **three from the United States: Joseph William Tobin, archbishop of Indianapolis. Blasé J. Cupich, archbishop of Chicago. Kevin Joseph Farrell, outgoing archbishop of Dallas and new prefect of the Vatican dicastery for laity, family and life.**

The other new cardinals come from the countries of: Syria, Central African Republic, Madrid, Brazil, Bangladesh, Venezuela, Belgium, Mauritius, Mexico, and Papua New Guinea.

Pope Francis also named cardinals from the following countries who are over 80 years of age and cannot vote for a new pope: Malaysia, Italy, Lesotho and —Rev. Ernest Simoni, a priest Albania - Fr. Simoni twice was condemned to death and imprisoned in Albania for being an outspoken critic of a very corrupt government.

CROP WALK...NEXT SUNDAY October 23rd

A CROP walk is a community effort to help alleviate hunger in the world and in our local community. The CROP walk is sponsored by St. Luke's, St. Mark's, Our Lady of the Mountain and Messiah Episcopal Church in Chester, NJ. We have had a CROP walk in town since 2008. If you have never participated it is really easy. It can be a fun family day. We walk from St. Luke's Church to the Middle School and back to St. Luke's a total of 3 miles.
