Pope Francis has urged us to be missionaries of mercy to one another. I pray that we have learned about the mercy of God in our own lives this year and that we not forget that we carry within us the power of extending the mercy of God to others at all time.

A THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK...from St. Mother Theresa of Calcutta -

"It is not for us to destroy what God has given to us. Please, please let your mind and your will become the mind and will of God. You have the power to bring war into the world or to build peace. Please choose the way of peace." – St. Mother Theresa received the Nobel Peace Prize for her efforts of working with the poor in India and promoting harmony among people of all classes.

WHY WE ARE CATHOLIC...

We are Catholic because we believe: We cannot be united with God unless we freely choose to love him. But we cannot love God if we sin gravely against him, against our neighbor or against ourselves... Our Lord warns us that we shall be separated from him if we fail to meet the serious needs of the poor and the little ones who are his brethren. To die in mortal sin without repenting and accepting God's merciful love means remaining separated from him forever by our own free choice. This state of definitive self-exclusion from communion with God and the blessed is called "hell." God predestines no one to go to hell; for this, a willful turning away from God (a mortal sin) is necessary, and persistence in it until the end. The Catechism of the Catholic Church 1033 & 1037

GLUTEN HOSTS...

In both St. Mark's and OLM we offer the use of Gluten free hosts for those who need them. The process that we follow in both parishes is that the person who needs such a host goes to where they are kept and puts it into a separate golden container called a PYX and places it on the offertory table and it is brought up to the altar. The priest takes the PYX along with the other hosts when he goes down to distribute communion. I mention this now because there might be someone who could benefit from the Gluten free host and also for those of you who use the hosts I would ask you to introduce yourself to Fr. Slawek a couple of times until he gets to recognize you on the communion line.

OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

First Reading: 2 Samuel 5:1-3

Samuel describes how all the tribes of Israel went to David in Hebron and said they were his bone and his flesh and it was he who led them back to Israel. The Lord told David he would be a shepherd to His people. David made an agreement with the elders and was anointed king.

Second Reading: Colossians 1:12-20

Paul explains to the Colossians that God has made them fit to share in the inheritance of the holy ones in light and that through the Son we have redemption and forgiveness of sin. He describes Jesus as the image of the invisible God, the head of the church and in Him all things hold together.

Gospel: Luke 23:35-43

Jesus is mocked by the crowd as he hung on the cross. Above him was an inscription that read "This is the king of the Jews." One of the men being crucified with Jesus tells Him to save them and Himself, while the other asks that he be remembered when Jesus is in his kingdom. Jesus said in reply, "Amen I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise."
