THE SEASON OF ADVENT

The first readings for Advent come from the prophets of old who proclaimed that when God comes among his people there would be a revival of spirit. They very often used the analogies of how a desert would blossom and be filled with water so too would the hearts of all people be renewed by God's love.

We enter into Advent this week and it is a time for us to remember that the coming of the Lord into our world at Christmas was very special. It is also a reminder that one day Jesus will come again at the end of time.

For us who live in this in between time it is important for us to recognize the presence of God among us in the people who love us and also the people who challenge us. As Christians living in the world who await the return of Jesus, we are responsible to live as he wishes us to live. The challenges to love all people even those who we feel we cannot love will show that we have learned the lesson of the Gospel that Jesus shows no partiality.

Pope Francis last week gave us a great example. As he closed the Jubilee year of Mercy he met with the poor and with prisoners and he apologized for the times that people have looked the other way when they encountered a poor person or a person in prison.

Beginning January 1, 2017, adoptees and certain relatives will be able to obtain a copy of their original birth certificate without a court order. The birth certificate will include the names of the birth parents who placed children for adoption unless a birth parent requests their name be omitted. First Reading: Isaiah 2:1-5

The words of Isaiah urge all people to forsake war and to live in peace forever. The tone reaches a climax in the words, "One nation shall not raise the sword against another, nor shall they train for war again."

Second Reading: Romans 13:11-14

Paul invites us to put away all the things of darkness and sin and to prepare for the coming of Christ.

Gospel: Matthew 24:37-44

A comparison is made between the destruction caused by the flood in Noah's time and the need to be prepared for the second coming of Christ. "You must be prepared in the same way. The Son of Man is coming at the time you least expect."
