FEAST OF ST. MARK APRIL 25 - ANNIVERSARY OF THE FOUNDING ST. MARK'S AS A PARISH 29 years ago..1988.

This week our parish celebrates the 29th anniversary of its founding as parish. After being a mission for a little over two years on the feast day of St. Mark we became the Parish Community of St. Mark the Evangelist.

St. Mark, the little we know about him, was a disciple of St. Peter and was the first person to actually write a gospel. His gospel is dated sometime in 60's A.D. St. Mark told of the many great miracles of Jesus especially of his driving out evil spirits and curing people of great illnesses.

The purpose of his Gospel was to present Jesus as the power and loving God among his people and to call forth from those who would read his gospel an affirmation of Faith in Jesus as the Son of God.

In one way St. Mark's parish parallels the development of the early church communities who first heard the gospel message of St. Mark. The parish community was small at its beginning but like the communities of the first century it took upon itself a particular character. St. Mark's has been known for its outreach to the needy and for the special care and protection of family life. The front page of the bulletin each week proclaims our parish mission statement. May the Lord continue to bless us as we move forward into the future as witnesses to the power of God among us...Fr. Joe

WHY WE ARE CATHOLIC...

We are Catholic because we believe: It is clear from the facts that the disciples' faith was drastically put to the test by their master's Passion and death on the cross, which he had foretold. The shock provoked by the Passion was so great that at least some of the disciples did not at once believe in the news of the Resurrection. Far from showing us a community seized by a mystical exaltation, the Gospels present us with disciples demoralized ("looking sad" and frightened. For they had not believed the holy women returning from the tomb and had regarded their words as an "idle tale". Even when faced with the reality of the risen Jesus the disciples are still doubtful, so impossible did the thing seem: they thought they were seeing a ghost.
